

PANAJACHEL, Guatemala — We're speeding to work across Lake Atitlan, the deepest lake in Central America.

Our destination is the village of Panabaj, located on the outskirts of Santiago Atitlan, a city of about 35,000 people. Our mission is to fulfil Frank Flaman's dream.

Raised on the family farm in Southey, Sask., Frank, turned vision and hard work into a company that is recognized nationally as a top supplier of agricultural machinery, fitness equipment and trailers.

Ten years ago, Frank created the Flaman Foundation, which donates \$1 million or more annually to charities. Funds come from his share of company profits and donations and are split equally between local charities and overseas aid organizations.

"Dad's dream is to eradicate world poverty," said Crystal, as we bounced across the massive lake formed by a volcano 84,000 years ago. "But he knows it's important to make a difference in one place at a time. Change happens, he says, by planting roots and working with a community."

We stepped ashore and our group of 13 volunteers walked a kilometre to Panabaj, where Flaman's volunteers have been helping for a decade. We soon had shovels and picks in our hands and began digging land to bring it to grade for a car park.

Mayor Juan Rimerez has envisioned a cooperative that would include a school; after-school program classes; community education and a tourism centre store where guides could be hired.

"I'd seen photos taken by previous groups and when I received an email this year asking if I was interested in volunteering, I replied with a huge 'YES'," said Mark Gibbons, who works at Flaman's Nisku flagship store.

My aching back got a break when I went to a corrugated-iron roofed, cement-block-built village on the far side of Santiago. There, Warren Kowalchuk, a fellow volunteer gave a few tips to locals building a cooking stove.

"Such stoves are life-changing," said Crystal. "Women no longer have to stoop over cooking on wood fires for hours and they help prevent one in five children dying from respiratory problems caused by smoke inhalation."

And every day a crowd of children gathered at Panabaj to watch our crew work.

"I was surprised when I showed kids pictures of snowy Canada and they asked to see more of Guatemala," said Curt Nordin, a Flaman IT manager in Yorkton, Sask., who brought two used computers for the school. "It was a novelty for them to see pictures of their own country."

Flaman Yard Safety

Summertime is fast approaching and the Flaman stores across the prairies are getting busy. Busy stores means a lot of product moving in and out of the Flaman yards. Safety is often a concept that moves to the back of our minds when we have stuff that we need to get done. That being said, it should always be top of our minds to prevent accidents and injuries in the work place.

Safety in the Flaman yard is both the staff and the customer's responsibility. Everyone wants to be safe.

1. Yard staff driving around the yard and moving equipment and trailers need to be aware of their surroundings at all times. Make sure to look behind you when you're backing up and always have a spotter walk with you if you

can't see all corners of the trailer.

their customer products or walking from building to building. Look in both directions for moving vehicles and make sure to make eye contact with the driver before crossing in front.

- Shop staff need to make sure to communicate with other people in the shop to avoid surprises. Wear proper safety equipment including safety glasses and steel-toed shoes. Clean up spills and messes to avoid tripping or slipping. Use the proper tools to complete the job and take your time when using the tool too. Saving some time isn't worth hurting yourself.
- Customers play a role as well. Although as a customer you usually are only in the Flaman yard for a short period of time, acting in a safe manner is important. Keep your head up when walking or driving in the yard. Drive at the posted speed limits and watch from staff members moving equipment. Do not drive in between trucks being unloaded and the machine that is unloading them. Drive safely around so that we can avoid any accidents.

Safety is everyone's responsibility!
